Dear Parents/Carers

Re: Parent Feedback

It has been great to meet a number of you over the last few weeks and thank you to those who have taken the time to introduce yourselves and wish me well in the new role.

Our partnership with parents is a crucial part of our work and parental feedback is a really important element of this. Over the next half term, we have **three opportunities** for parents to provide insights and input to help guide our decision making and priorities as a school.

Parent Survey (Open now until 11.55pm on Sunday 9th November)

Every year we survey parents to gauge satisfaction with the school on a range of different measures. Most of the questions are those produced by Ofsted. By using these, we can get a good understanding of trends over time – identifying areas of strength and areas for development. The final few questions are school specific, relating to current priorities.

The survey will take approximately 5-15 minutes to complete depending on the time taken to share optional comments. It would be great to hear from as many parents as possible to give us a full picture across the school. We recognise that many of you will have multiple children at the school, and the experience they have may be different. We have therefore set the survey up so it is for one child. Multiple surveys will therefore be required for multiple children.

Our intention will be to provide feedback before the Christmas holiday. I am a firm believer that if parents take time to answer survey questions, they receive both a summary of the findings, and a guide to the actions taken as a result of feedback.

Parent Forum

Our termly parent forum will take place **5.30-6.15pm** on **Tuesday 18th November** in **The Venue**. The format for this first forum will be a short presentation from me, followed by an opportunity for parents to split into groups to discuss some key aspects of the school. These will be:

- Curriculum
- Communication
- Expectations and systems
- Pastoral support



We will use the feedback from the parent survey to guide discussion questions. Parents will have the opportunity to join three different discussion groups (on a rotation), with notes taken by colleagues on the leadership team.

Mobile Phone Consultation

As shared last week, we are actively looking at our approach to mobile phones for next term. Coincidentally, this item is being discussed across Coventry and Warwickshire and schools are being petitioned to strengthen their policies. The focus of this is not so much on learning, but on the need to sufficiently safeguard our young people against the harmful content that is so easy to access online, and the knock-on effects that this is having on mental health.

This consultation will take place **5.00-6.00pm on Thursday 13th November**. We will begin by hearing from Charlotte Ashton, journalist and regional leader for Smartphone Free Childhood in Warwickshire. We will then present some different options we are considering as a school and collect parent feedback on these. Following the consultation, we will draw up an implementation plan in regard to next steps.

I know from the responses received from last weeks' communication that there is a lot of support for this, and I know many of you will have some great insights that we would love you to share.
